Transfer students from CCV who have obtained an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree will have the NVU general education program requirements waived. Transfer courses from regionally accredited institutions will be accepted if grades are C- or better.

<p><b>Interdisciplinary Studies Requirements</b></p>
<p><i>Students must successfully complete a total of 42 credits, at least 21 of which must be upper-division, as follows:</i></p>
<p>18 credits in a primary area of study <i>(some may be taken at CCV)</i></p>
<p>12 credits in a secondary, supporting area of study <i>(some may be taken at CCV)</i></p>
<p>9 credits in a tertiary area of study <i>(some may be taken at CCV)</i></p>
<p>3 credit capstone course: INT 4610 Senior Seminar in Interdisciplinary Studies</p>
<p>An extended classroom experience, which may be credit or non-credit bearing, must be at least 20 hours in length. It can be completed through an existing course, internship, student teaching or service-learning experience.</p>
