Upward Bound Summer 2021 Re:Bound Summer Academic Boot Camp

We are so excited that we will get to see all of you in person this summer and that we can offer you a summer session that is as educational, fun, and exciting as always! The Summer Program will take place from June 13th to July 23rd. Students have been assigned to cohorts, based on their age and grade, and will spend two weeks living on campus and participating in college preparatory programming. Cohort based sessions will run on the following schedule:

June 13th—June 25th: Rising Seniors
 June 27th—July 9th: Rising Juniors

• July 11th—July 23rd: Rising Freshman & Sophomores

That being said, with the COVID-19 pandemic still a prevalent issue, your health and safety are at the forefront of our concerns. To ensure that our Summer Program will be carried out in a manner that is safe, we will be implementing measures which have been established by the college, state, and federal guidelines for residential summer programs. While it will change the scope of how our summer program typically operates, this will also ensure that every participant will be safe.

Vaccinated students will not be required to wear masks indoors or outdoors, but we will still ask students to maintain social distancing. Vaccinated students will be allowed to travel off campus for special events, to attend sporting events or practices, and / or participate in community activities.

Unvaccinated students will still be required to wear a mask when inside the classrooms, the residence hall, and as they move through the hallways. Social distancing of at least 6 feet will be required. Unvaccinated students will not be allowed to travel off campus – except weekends - during their two weeks in residence. They will also be required to show a negative COVID test when they arrive on campus the 1st week and the 2nd week. These tests should be scheduled on the Thursday or Friday before they begin the summer program and before they return for week 2. Students who feel unsafe attending an in-person Summer Program or are not comfortable following these regulations will not be required to attend. This is a college and CDC rule and one that we have to follow until we hear differently.

Summer Orientation Meetings June 5th—By Cohort!

One more reminder—we expect all of you to be here next Saturday at the times listed below for our Summer Orientation Meeting. As you know, the meeting, happening **June 5th**, will be by cohort and we will give you all the information you need to know about your summer session and details about what we expect of you in your classes, your work-study contracts, and the social part of the program.

Our plan is to meet with each cohort student and one of their parents in ASAC 100. Families will be stationed at their own, individual tables. We will have a quick introduction to the summer residential program, talk about classes, and expectations for the summer, take pictures, and then release all of you for the day. We want to meet you all in person as well as your families. If you have questions or concerns please call Rick or Ryan ASAP!

Upward Bound Summer Travel

As you know, our Summer travel plans are limited by the rules of the college and the Vermont Governor's State of Emergency decree. Right now the only students who can travel are the ones who have been vaccinated. We have scheduled a Senior Rafting Trip with Adventure Bound for the weekend following the their Summer Program. We will take about 10 students and three staff members to Caratunk, Maine for this once in a lifetime adventure. At Adventure Bound, there is an outdoor pool, a 10 person Hot Tub, and a climbing wall. Our students have really enjoyed this in the past and we hope to be able to offer it to other students towards the end of the summer.

Additionally, once we are allowed to travel, the Tutor Counselors are looking at potential adventures for all of you for the summer. Here are a few options that we have looked at:



Mount Independence State Historic Site is one of the nation's most significant Revolutionary War sites, offering six miles of trails along the archaeological remains of the fortification. Jointly owned and managed by the State of Vermont's Division for Historic Preservation and the Fort Ticonderoga Association, Mount Independence documents the critical efforts to defend northern New York, New England, and the cause of American liberty.

Robert Lincoln built **Hildene** as a summer home at the turn of the 20th century. He was the only child of Abraham and Mary Todd Lincoln to

survive to maturity. Robert first visited Manchester as a young man in the summer of 1864 when he came to the Equinox Hotel to meet his mother and his brother Tad. Some forty years later he returned to purchase 392 acres of land to build what he would call his ancestral home. Robert and wife Mary named their Manchester home based on their views of the Taconic Mountains to the west, Green Mountains to the east and the Battenkill flowing through the great valley of Vermont below.



Summer Work Study Stipends

Although we do not expect to have our traditional Work Study component this summer, we are still planning on awarding **EVERY UPWARD BOUND** student a summer work study stipend. This will also include soon to be college freshmen! Our federal grant allows us to award larger summer career stipends if our students do certain things. During



most summers it means Jobsites and our Career and College Counseling classes. This summer each cohort will have a list of things to do to ensure that we can meet the requirements for the Work-study stipend. Students who complete the summer work-study component will receive \$200 for each week that they are here.

For most students it will be relatively easy: attend the college counseling seminars, career and college searches, and participate in college and career explorations. Here is an overview of what you should expect:

College Freshmen, your to do list to be eligible for the Work-study Stipend:

- Summer check in with Upward Bound Staff
- Participate in the Upward Bound College 101 Workshop June 30th
- Present a 4-year college curriculum plan for your chosen major
- Submit all financial aid award letters and your college email, address and first semester class list.

Seniors

- Will attend Senior Seminar,
- Develop their college admission and scholarship essays,
- Complete their FAFSA and VSAC or NHCF forms,
- And complete a practice Common Application.
- Research and present a 4 year college plan for their intended major.

Juniors

- Will develop a College Matrix,
- Develop a college bound resume,
- Investigate careers that will meet their needs,
- And explore requirements for their prospective career.

Sophomores and Freshman

- Will complete the Self Directed search,
- Complete and fill out their Upward Bound activities sheet,
- Evaluate their transcripts,
- And research majors that match their personalities!

It will be an interesting summer and these activities will help you to become a more focused student with a better understanding of what careers will match your career expectations. We can't wait for Summer!



Communication Devices Policy

Registering for College Classes

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Career Spotlight



Ecology


Ecology is a branch of Biology that deals with the relations of organisms to one another and to their physical surroundings. In essence, it is the study of the relationships between living organisms, including humans, and their physical environment. Ecology considers organisms at the individual, population, community, ecosystem, and biosphere level. Ecology also provides information about the benefits of ecosystems and how we can use Earth's resources in ways that leave the environment healthy for future generations. Ecologists study many types of environments ranging from the microscopic bacteria growing in a fish tank and microbes living under your feet, to animals and plants in the rain forest, and the interactions between thousands of plant, animal, and other communities in the desert. There are many specialties within ecology such as marine, vegetation, and statistical ecology, and they all play a role in providing us with information that helps us better understand the world around us. This information can also help us improve our environment, manage our natural resources, and protect human health. For example: in the 1960s, ecological research identified two of the major causes of poor water quality in lakes and streams-phosphorous and nitrogen-which were found in large amounts in laundry detergents and fertilizers. Provided with this information, citizens were able to take the necessary steps to help restore their communities' lakes and streams-many of which are once again popular for fishing and swimming. Whether you are interested in environmental science, biology, public health, agriculture, forestry, food systems, biomedicine, or even public policy, community development, or education, this might be the major for you!




