### Your Brain and Pain: Improving Treatment for TBI and PTS

Dr. Sarah Paquette — Location: Room T202

Join Dr. Sarah Paquette as she discusses the relationship between chronic pain, TBI, and PTSD. By providing a basic understanding of neurology, Dr. Paquette gives people the context to understand what is happening in the brain and body, and why we must change the way we treat it. ### **Building Your Team: Finding the Right Care for Your Health Goals**

Dr. Sarah Paquette — Location: Room T202

We all know how important it is to have the right tool for the job, but when it comes to choosing the right care for your pain, it's sometimes hard to know what you need. In this workshop-style discussion, Dr. Sarah Paquette will introduce complementary medicine and home care options for chronic pain and post-concussive syndrome, and help Veterans understand what the best care is based on their symptoms and goals. We will also cover how to screen a provider, and discuss what we can do at home to improve our own health and wellbeing.

### No Veteran Should be Without a Place to Call Home

The VA Homeless Services Program, Veterans who have experienced homelessness — Location: Room LAC 343

The VA National Homeless Services Program recently issued a challenge to permanently house 38,000 Veterans experiencing homelessness. This challenge is a collaboration with programs including Supportive Services for Veterans and Families, Grant and Per Diem, and Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing. The goal to end Veterans homelessness is not new, but again highlights the efforts and policies to ensure that homelessness is a rare, brief, and one-time occurrence. Join us for an interactive panel discussion and a presentation on programs available to Veterans experiencing or at risk of becoming homeless. Hear and discuss the strengths, challenges, and opportunities to best support Veterans experiencing homelessness.









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### **SPEAKER BIOS**



**Sebastian Junger** is the best-selling author of *War*, about American soldiers in Afghanistan's infamous Korengal Valley, as well as *Tribe*, about their struggles adjusting to life back home. His documentary *Restrepo* - which he shot, directed and produced with photojournalist Tim Hetherington - won the Grand Jury Prize at the 2010 Sundance Film Festival and was nominated for an Oscar the following year. Junger remains committed to helping veterans and is the originator of Vets Town Halls. At a Vets Town Hall, veterans of any era who served in any capacity have the right to stand before their community and speak for up to ten minutes about what it was like to serve their country. These events are non-political, and all perspectives are valued. His most recent book is *Freedom*.

Jon Turner served with the U.S. Marines from 2003-2007 as an infantryman, deploying to Haiti on a humanitarian mission and twice to Iraq in Fallujah and Ramadi. Since getting out of the service, he has worked with various communities in the United States to assist with the veteran reintegration process through agriculture and outdoor recreation. This past year, he helped launch the 22 Peaks Challenge, a fundraiser to support veteran organizations actively working to prevent veteran suicide. Jon currently operates Wild Roots Community Farm in Bristol, a 10-acre operation dedicated to community resilience through food systems education and wilderness living skills. Misha Pemble-Belkin served nine years as an Army Paratrooper from 2006 through 2015. He successfully completed two combat tours to the Kunar Provence of Afghanistan with a total of 27 months spent in country. On his second tour he was injured and required a medical retirement from the service in 2015. Misha Pemble-Belkin became a participant of Vermont Adaptive Veteran Venture Program during the winter of 2015-2016. He then interned with Vermont Adaptive during the winter and summer of 2017, and then began a VA Work Study that fall. Misha graduated with a degree in S.T.E.M. Studies from the Community College of Vermont in 2017, and now runs Vermont Adaptive Ski and Sports Veteran Ventures.

**Steven Gagner** is the co-founder of 14th Star Brewing Company, located in St. Albans, Vermont. He developed the idea for the community service-centric brewery while deployed to Afghanistan in 2010 and founded the brewery in 2012. In the last 10 years, the brewery has grown to distribute in nine US states and has won several awards for both the world-class quality of its beer as well as its unparalleled philanthropy. Personally, Steve was named the 2019 Small Business Administration's Business Person of the Year, the Army Times' 2018 Entrepreneur of the Year, and was a 2014 *Vermont Business Magazine* Rising Star (40-under-40). He is still serving in the Army and is currently a student at the United States Army War College. He lives in St. Albans, Vermont with his wife and two children.





**Brett Rusch, MD,** was appointed Executive Director for the White River Junction VA Medical Center and its seven Community-Based Outpatient Clinics on April 28, 2019. He is a practicing psychiatrist and mental health expert, and has been providing care to Veterans throughout his medical career. Additionally, Dr. Rusch is active as an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Dartmouth's Geisel School of Medicine, and as White River Junction's Executive Director he represents VA as an ex-officio member of Geisel's Board of Advisors.

Dr. Rusch received a bachelor's degree in Psychology from the University of Wisconsin and completed his medical degree and a psychiatry residency at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health (UWSMPH).

Dr. Rusch originally joined the White River Junction VA in 2015 as the Chief of Mental Health and Behavioral Science Services. He then served as Chief of Staff from December 2016 through April 2019. Prior to joining the White River Junction team, Dr. Rusch served as Director of Inpatient and Intensive Outpatient Mental Health Services at the William S. Middleton Memorial Veterans Hospital in Madison, WI. During his tenure at the Madison VA Hospital, he was on the faculty at the UWSMPH, where he received the Department of Psychiatry's Award for Excellence in Resident Education for the three consecutive academic years bridging 2012-2015.

Sophie Zdatny — After five and a half years with the law firm Dinse, Knapp & McAndrew in Burlington, Vermont, where she represented a number of higher education clients, Sophie joined the Vermont State Colleges first as Associate General Counsel in August 2014 and then as General Counsel, effective January 1, 2017. She previously practiced employment law with Allan Karlin & Associates in Morgantown, West Virginia, following a two-year federal clerkship with Judge Irene Keeley of the Northern District of West Virginia, and two years with Kay, Casto & Chaney, PLLC. She also taught appellate advocacy and served as an adjunct professor in the Immigration Law Clinic at West Virginia University's College of Law. Sophie lives in Essex Junction, Vermont with her husband. She has two children, a daughter in Newton, Massachusetts, and a son in London, England.





**NVU Interim President John W. Mills** served as president of Paul Smith's College in New York for ten years and three years at Mount Aloysius College in Pennsylvania. He also served as Provost at both institutions. Dr. Mills has a B.S. in Zoology from the University of Rhode Island and a Ph.D. in Biology from Brown University. He has also been a faculty member at MIT, Harvard Medical School, Dartmouth Medical School, and Clarkson University. Additionally, Dr. Mills has a robust background in civic engagement, including over a decade of service on the Saranac Lake Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, where he also served two years as President, seven years on the Board of Directors of the Adirondack Economic Development Corporation, two years on the Executive Roundtable of the Blair County Chamber of Commerce, and two years on the Board of Directors of the Cambria County Chamber of Commerce.



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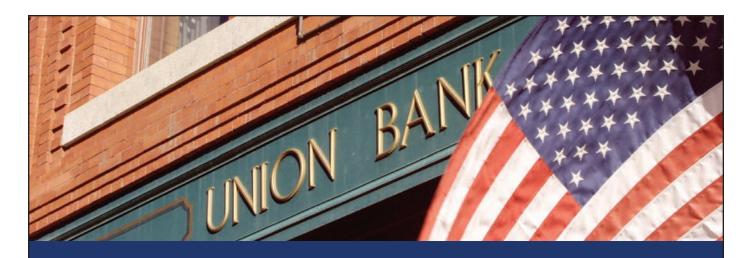
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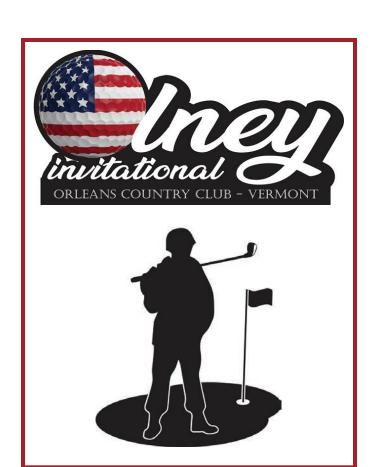


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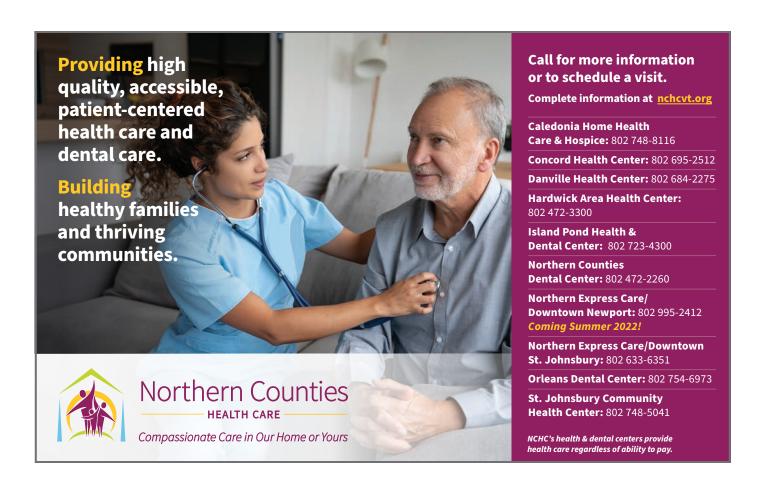
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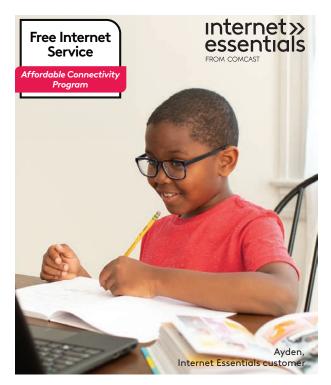
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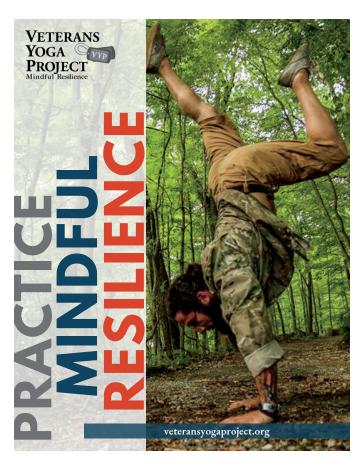
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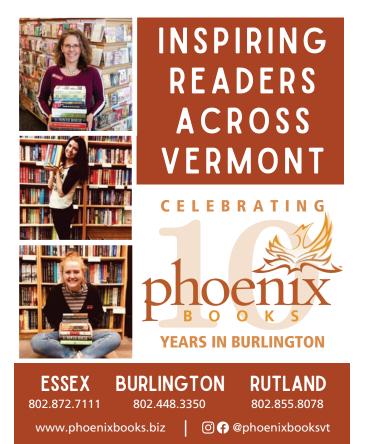


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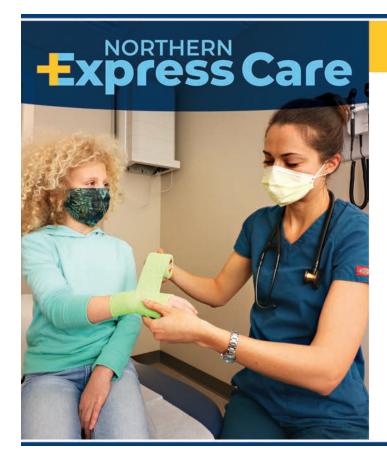
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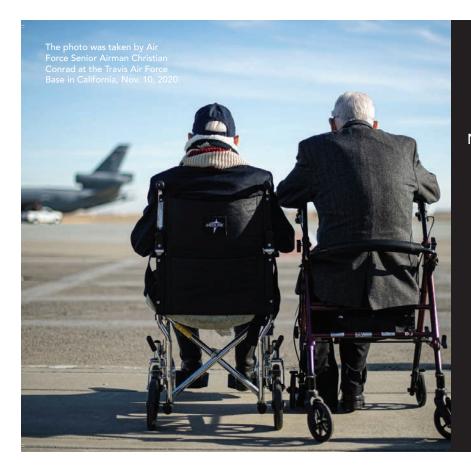
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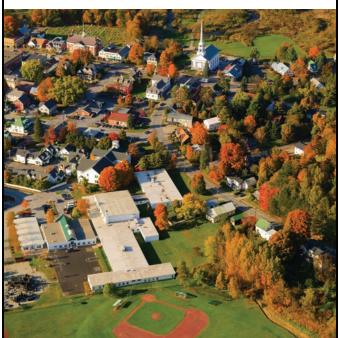
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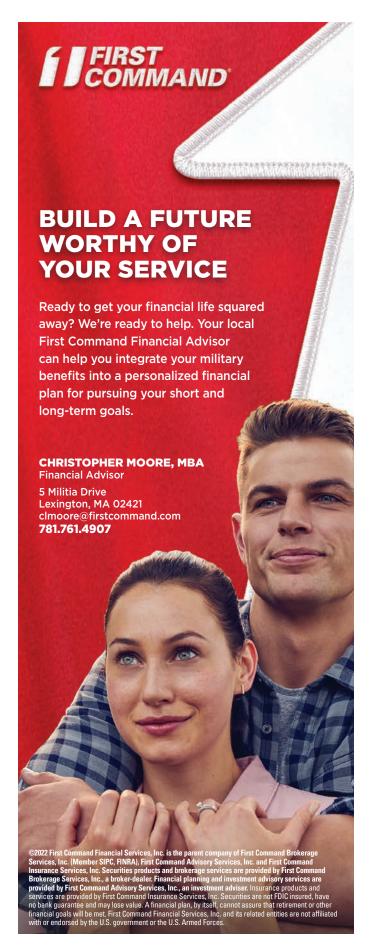


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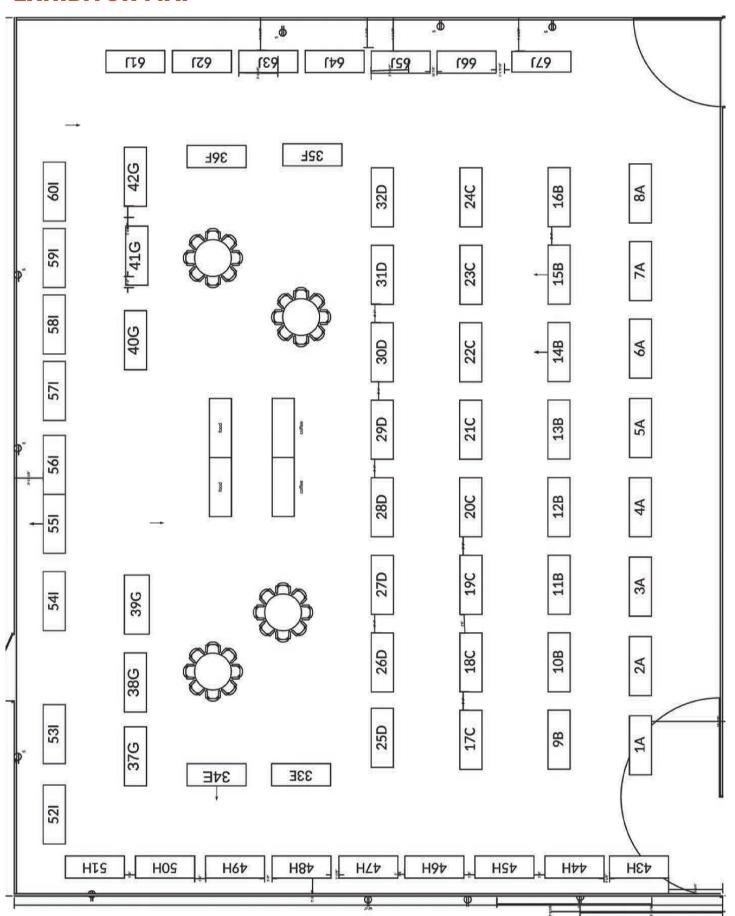
